With the recently acquired land adjoining Zollinger Park, we now have room to add more amenities for the citizens of Providence. As a result, we have identified \$300,000 in our current budget to build a skate park, but we and our citizen partners feel that the residents of Providence would enjoy a larger, nicer park, which will cost in the range of \$600,000 to \$800,000. The complexity of the park will be reflected in the amount of monetary participation from interested citizens. Based on fundraising outcomes and contractor availability, construction could begin as early as mid-2023! Join us as we reach to meet our goal of raising \$300,000. ## Plowing by Priority

As a reminder, our roads are plowed by priority. We work to clear the major thoroughfares that move the most traffic first, then move to the lesser traveled streets with cul-de-sacs and dead ends being cleared last. We also wait to widen the streets until all roads have been cleared for safe travel. Some storms require that we stay on the major thoroughfares longer than anticipated, which delays the plows from getting to the lesser traveled streets. Please know we strive to clear all roads as quickly as possible. If you have questions or concerns, feel free to contact us at (435) 753-0313.

PRIORITY

- To limit obstructions for the plows, please remove your garbage and recycling cans once they have been emptied; and,
- Maintain a minimum 3 foot area around fire hydrants that are adjacent to your property.

## License Renewals Due January 31st

Annual business and dog license renewal invoices have been mailed. Please call us at (435) 752-9441 if you haven't seen yours, are no longer in business, your beloved pet has crossed the rainbow bridge or has been re-homed so we can update our records.

All licenses are dated January 1st and expire on December 31st of each year. Annual fees are due January 1st and delinquent after January 31st; at which time penalties apply.

In order to receive a new license, you will need to submit your renewal fees, changes you may have, and proof of a valid professional license or rabies certificate (if those previously provided have expired).

## Winter Parking Regulations

Winter parking hours are in effect now through April 15th. During this time, parking in the city right-of-way is prohibited between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. the next day.
